YEAR 3/4 CLASS

Hi families,

Our units of work are well under this term. The first maths focus of statistics is complete and we now move onto symmetry and mapping. These are interesting real life concepts so see if you and your child can spot examples of symmetry in our everyday world or ask them to give you directions to get home.

In HaSS, we are continuing our exploration of the First Fleet and what has changed or stayed the same since 1778. The students have really enjoyed learning about this history and are sure to fire some facts at you if you asked.



Our knowledge of the properties of materials is extending too and we even took a look at the Natural History Museum's collection of Woppaburra People (Keppel Island First Nations) artefacts, which included a variety of tools, shelters and clothing. This was a way for the students to deepen their understanding that different material properties are used for different purposes.

Speaking of First Nations peoples, we are well into the 'problem' section of our class novel Nerra, as she tries to put back together the broken rainbow and restore balance to country. You can see in the picture the class doing a good job of recalling and organising the order of events and describing key characters.

Perhaps you could ask your child to tell you about what they have learnt.
